Equipment Boost

Last year, I was notified that our school has been successful in receiving a \$55,000 in funding through the Equipment Boost for Schools. This grant will see new furnishings and sensory items to create inclusive environments within all of our classrooms and the school library. This idea has been developed though positive findings from the implementation of the school's Calm Room project and a further desire to progress these findings into the classroom. Funding is granted to support the school's long term plan to duplicate the Calm Room environment into the classroom environment.

Our new furniture and sensory resources are due to arrive in the coming weeks. We look forward to our students benefiting from these resources as Gladesville continues to make improvements in student engagement, teaching and learning.




